Reflection: *Chapter 7 On False Confidence and Arrogance:* "It is foolish to put your trust in humans- or in any creature for that matter. Why should you mind serving others or being poor in the eyes of the world, as long as you do it for the love of Jesus Christ? Put all your confidence in God, but do not trust yourself." Do what you can to please Him and He will reward you well for your good will. Do not trust your own cleverness nor that of any person; rather, put your trust in the grace of God, Who gives aid to the humble but humiliates the presumptuous. 2. Do not boast of riches if you have them, or of your important friends; but glory in God only, from Whom all good things come and Who, being the highest good, desires to give us Himself. Do not boast of beauty of body, which is soon disfigured by illness or age. Do not be proud of any talents or skills you possess, for in this way you displease God from Whom you have received them. 3. Do not consider yourself better than others, for you may be worse in God's sight. Do not be proud of your good works, for often what pleases us displeases God, whose judgments differ from the judgment of humans. Whatever goodness or virtue is in you, believe that your neighbor has better qualities; in this way you will preserve humility. It will not hurt you to consider yourself worse than others, even if this is not really so; but it will hurt great if you prefer yourself above another, although that person might be a greater sinner. A humble person is a peaceful person; but the hearts of the proud are full of envy and resentment."

Chapter 8 On Avoiding Too Much Familiarity: "Do NOT open your heart to everyone, but only to one who is wise, God-fearing, and who can keep your confidence. Spend little time in the company of young people or with the inexperienced; do not flatter the rich, or seek to be in the presence of the great without good reason. Rather associate yourself with those who are humble and have simplicity, who are devout and self-disciplined, talking with them about those things that will edify and strengthen the soul. Do not be familiar with the opposite sex, but commend to God those who are good. Desire to be on intimate terms with God and His Angels, but shun the acquaintance of people as much as you can. 2. Have charity for all; but familiarity is unwise. Sometimes it happens that we know someone only by fame, but when we meet that person we are often disappointed. And sometimes we think we please others by our presence, when in reality they come to dislike us because of the faults they see in us."
